BY THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION:

WHEREAS, the Shreveport Bossier African American Chamber of Commerce (SBAACC) was organized in 1941 to service the community of Northwest Louisiana in the expansion of minority business; and

WHEREAS, the SBAACC hosts a minority business expo to showcase the goods and services of over 80 businesses; and

WHEREAS, \$25,000 remained from the 2021 budget appropriation for SBAACC; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the 2022 Economic Development Fund Budget to re-appropriate the remaining of \$25,000 from the 2021 budget for SBAACC; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Caddo Parish Commission in due, legal and regular session convened, that Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Economic Development Fund for the year 2022 is hereby amended as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 6162 of 2022

BY THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION:

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING APPROVAL FOR AN ADDITIONAL SEPTIC SYSTEM AT 153 MONIQUE DRIVE, SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA, AMENDING SECTION 52-55 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR THAT APPROVAL, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, Section 52-55 of the Code of Ordinances provides for use of individual septic systems;

WHEREAS, that section provides for a variance from the requirements of the section by requesting an exemption by ordinance,

WHEREAS, the owner of 153 Monique Drive has established grounds for the variance; and

WHEREAS, that variance must be memorialized by ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Caddo Parish Commission in due, legal and regular session convened, that Section 52-55 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 52-55. Where community-type system not available.

Where community-type systems are not available, an individual system may be used subject to the following requirements:

* * * * *

- (7) Exceptions granted based on having met the requirements of Subsection (5)
 - a. Lot 8, LaBonne Terre Unit No. 3 (153 Monique Drive, Shreveport, Louisiana)

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any provision or item of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

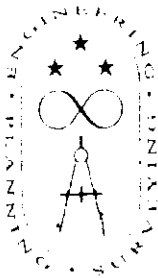

Our firm, Mohr and Associates, Inc. was retained by Ms. Crystal Basco to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the feasibility of, and potential health risks associated with, installing an additional mechanical sewage treatment plant and associated septic sprinkler on the property located at 153 Monique Drive in Caddo Parish.

I have personally visited the site and assessed the situation; and in my professional opinion, the installation of an additional mechanical sewage treatment plant and associated septic sprinkler is feasible (see attached plat) and safe.

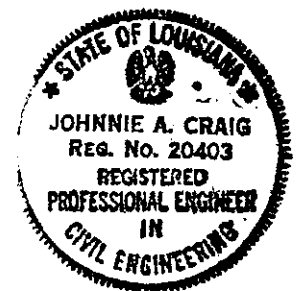
The Basco property is elongated in a North-South direction, with the current and future structures located primarily on the Northern half of the tract. Thus, there is sufficient area on the Southern portion of the tract to accommodate a treatment plant and sprinkler. In my professional opinion, this project will cause no adverse impact to Ms. Basco's neighbors or the surrounding properties.

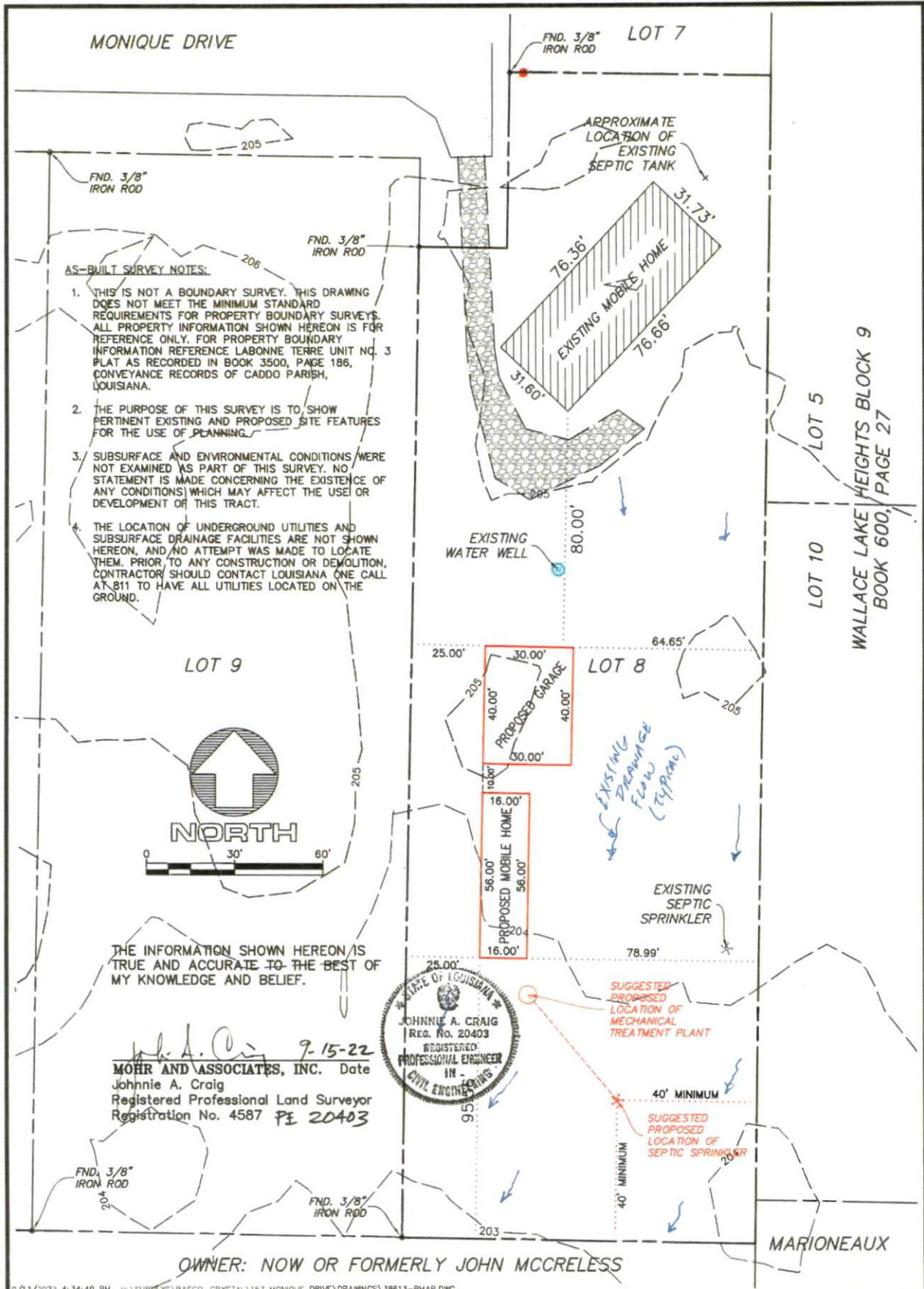

RESOLUTION NO 46 OF 2022

BY THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION:

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL CERTIFICATION TO THE STATE OF LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND DEVELOPMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE OFF-SYSTEM BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO

WHEREAS, the Code of Federal Regulations mandates that all structures defined as bridges located on all public roads shall be inspected, rated for safe load capacity, and posted in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards; and

WHEREAS, an inventory of the aforementioned bridges shall be maintained by each state; and

WHEREAS, the responsibility to inspect, rate and loads post these bridges under the authority of the Parish of Caddo in accordance with the above-cited standards is delegated by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development to the Parish of Caddo.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Caddo Parish Commission in due, legal and regular session convened, that the Caddo Parish Commission does hereby certify to the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development that the Parish will perform the following for the period of 1 October 2022 through 30 September 2023:

1. The Parish will perform interim inspections on all bridges within Caddo Parish, as required.
2. The Parish will load rate non-timber bridges within Caddo Parish, as required.
3. The Parish will load post or close bridges within Caddo Parish, as required.
4. The Parish will verify the inventory data pertaining to all bridges within Caddo Parish, as required.

These stipulations are prerequisites to participation by the Parish in the Off-System Bridge Replacement Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any provision or item of this resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications, and to this end, the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 6259 OF 2022

BY THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUDGET OF ESTIMATED REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR THE RIVERBOAT FUND AND THE OIL AND GAS FUND TO PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE SAFE SUMMER PROGRAM AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO

WHEREAS, the Safe Summer Program provided funding for Parish-sponsored recreational and quality of life initiatives that help youth and other Parish citizens sustain a safe and healthy environment; and

WHEREAS, additional funds are needed to continue programs through the end of the year; and

WHEREAS, the Caddo Parish Commission would like to appropriate an additional \$15,000 for additional programming; and

WHEREAS, the Parks Department will host programming though the end of year within the stated budget; and

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the 2022 Riverboat Fund and the Oil and Gas Fund in the amount of \$15,000 to extend the Safe Summer Program until the end of the year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Caddo Parish Commission in due, legal and regular session convened, that Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Riverboat and Oil and Gas Funds for the year 2022 is hereby amended as follows:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that additional programming through the end of 2022 will not exceed \$15,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any provision or item of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
