

MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION
OF THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION
HELD ON THE 5th DAY OF AUGUST, 2024

The Caddo Parish Commission met in a Work Session, on the above date, at 3:30 p.m., in the Government Chambers, with Mrs. Gage-Watts, presiding, and the following members in attendance constituting a quorum: Commissioners Atkins, Blake, Burrell, Cothran, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Jones, Kracman, Lazarus, Thomas, G. Young, and J. Young (12). ABSENT: None (0).

The Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were given. There were no Agenda Additions, so the Commission moved onto Citizens Comments.

CITIZENS COMMENTS

Tiffany Hyde came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Good afternoon. I come today to address the matter of the Lakeview Water District that was added to today's agenda. Back in August, we had the issue that was given much attention in regard to a decision made by Commissioner Young over District Two. We held a water board meeting that Mr. Young attended, and it got heated. In that meeting, I sat and listened to a Commissioner raise his voice over us and placed his hand in my face when I asked to speak in hopes of de-escalating a conversation. But I was directly told no. He reminded us all of his overall authority and walked out with aggressive comments towards another board member. In that meeting, I felt threatened, fearful and intimidated due to those feelings—at that time, I had given resignation. After much thought, I attended the following Commission meeting on May 6, 2024, and publicly rescinded my resignation before this very Commission in order to continue my duties, as I felt those were more important to my community and our water board as a whole. It was after my rescinded statement at the meeting that Mr. Young stated he accepted the resignation, which at that time would have required a vote amongst the Commission. The vote did not take place. I reached out as to where I stood, however, never once got a direct answer; therefore, according to the bylaws of our Lakeview Water District, I resume business on that board. And in our last meeting on August 1, we had a very successful and productive meeting amongst ourselves with Mr. Young's—without Mr. Young's presence. We brought some much-needed conversations to the table and worked those out in order to regroup and continue our work together as a board. I've given you each a copy of the minutes. And I would also. I also in there have included the per diem check for which I received. I've also provided a copy of our bylaws and what they state as far as removal and appointments for the board. Board members were not made aware of such removal of myself; and I did not know that myself nor Bob Brown were being replaced. Laws and bylaws are written for a reason—they are not to be ignored due to personal opinion, government overreach, or abuse of power. I stand when our constitution says and represents to our country as I pledge, just as we did at the very opening of this meeting. I take pride in the words, "to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God".

Tracy and KayLynn Little came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

We've lived in Shreveport all of our lives. We are here today to ask for your approval to Ordinance No. 6449 of 2024 and the PZC case 24-21-P. It is for the property located at 1133 Kay Lane that we own and is currently C-1. We are requesting it to be rezoned to C-2 for the purpose of opening a venue. The building has been vacant for many years. It was originally the location for Woodsman of the World, which was a fraternal organization much like the Lions Club, Shriners or the Masonic Lodge. Also, to my understanding it was the location of two churches. 1133 is already in a multi-use area. There are a few residents on the east and vacant lots on the south and the north. The WH Booth Lodge is to the west and the property along with Blue Air & Septic. There are several industrial businesses such as Super ATV, Everything Marketing, and Morris Dixon. Less than half a mile south down East Kings Hwy, there are several C-3 businesses such as TNR, Metalworks, Pro Film and Black Label Services. Under C-1, there are businesses that offer the same services that we will be offering. For example, indoor amusement lodge and meeting hall, place of worship and a restaurant. All of these rent their facilities out for the same events that our business will be doing. KayLynn is 22 years old and a senior at Louisiana Tech getting a degree in business. We definitely see a need in southeast Shreveport for a medium sized venue. There are smaller and some larger, but we are wanting a nice, affordable place where families and businesses can use our facility multiple times. Our building will be beautifully updated. A beautifully updated place to hold family events such as bridal or baby showers, a graduation party or a 50th wedding reception, or a place where businesses can hold corporate meetings, awards, banquets, employee training or holiday parties. Our main focus is going to be events that are held during the day. Today we have given each of you a packet that includes the existing floor plan, the revised floor plan, preliminary site plan—which does not show the finalized landscaping, and the additional parking areas, a picture of the privacy fence, and four letters from neighbors that are in support of the zoning change. Hopefully, this will give you an idea of what we would like the space to look like. With us owning the building, we have a vested interest in keeping the property values up. The building will be maintained. We want other people to open new businesses and continue to see growth and good things for Shreveport. Thank you for your time today.

Jon Glover came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

I stand before you all asking for consideration—consideration as a constituent who stands

before you on numerous of occasions addressing issues that are paramount to me to get an understanding or an explanation. Oftentimes, as a constituent standing before you all, I don't always receive the feedback that I'm looking for, the information that addresses the need that I bring before you. Instead, I am met with comments after the fact that are not representative of good professional decorum towards me. Now, I know that there are others who have met the same and similar, and we often ask why no one comes to our meetings. Well, no one is going to come to a meeting whereby they are going to become the whipping boy because that is not what we are here for. You all have been elected to address the needs of our Parish. And though each of you address the districts individually, collectively you represent the Parish as a whole. So, it is of the utmost importance that when I or anyone has anything to say to you all with regards to an agenda item, that that item be received as given. If there are comments, allow, if you're going to debate it, the person who brings those comments to you an opportunity to rebut. Because when it is that your comments are, the comments with no regard is given to the constituent who brought them forward, then we are at a disadvantage. We're not here to be beat down. We're not here to beat you all down either, but we are here to bring forth to you all any concern or consideration that requires your attention. Two, the act of englobing. You know, that is a tool that I feel like you all use to not address issues that we need to understand. And you do it quite often. I think it's something that you all should revisit. Because in global. And again, if there's an item that I want to hear a conversation about, you advance it. You don't talk about it at the Work Session. So that means what? I got to come back on Thursday to hear you all discuss it? This is what the Work Session is supposed to be about. It is supposed to be about you all addressing agenda items that you put on the this agenda—whether it's going to be advanced and how you will support or not support based on your conversation. You don't have to tell us you're going to adopt it, but at least give us a chance to know what you're going to do or what the legislation really means. I thank you for your time, and I pray that you don't take this as an indictment, not an antagonistic moment, but just as a constituent who wants to understand the purpose of why she comes and stands before you all. Thank you.

There were no Visitors, so the Commission moved to Reports.

It was **moved by Mr. Jones**, seconded by Mrs. Gage-Watts, *to take the agenda out of order and present the Special Resolution for Jeffrey Batiste.* Motion carried by acclamation.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION JEFFREY BATISTE

WHEREAS, Jeffrey Batiste Jr. was afforded the extraordinary opportunity to play soccer in Rome, Italy, where he competed against professional academy teams; and

WHEREAS, Jeffrey participated in soccer tryouts held in Louisiana, Georgia, and Florida, and was selected to be a member of the prestigious Dream Team 2024 International Soccer Team; and

WHEREAS, this remarkable opportunity allowed Jeffrey to advance and showcase his soccer skills, and to grow as a player by training and competing with pro-academy teams in Europe; and

WHEREAS, during his time in Rome, Jeffrey was voted MVP of a training session, served as team captain for their second game, and contributed to the team's victory against VSJ Velletri; and

WHEREAS, Jeffrey received an individual player evaluation by a UEFA licensed coach, achieving an impressive score of 9/10; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his athletic accomplishments, Jeffrey had the opportunity to visit significant landmarks in Rome, including The Ancient City of Rome, The Colosseum, The Vatican City, The Pantheon, The Spanish Steps, and The Trevi Fountain; and

WHEREAS, this overall experience not only enhanced Jeffrey's athletic abilities but also broadened his cultural horizons and provided him with valuable life experiences; and

WHEREAS, Jeffrey Batiste Jr. has represented our community with excellence, serving as a commendable ambassador of Caddo Parish on the international stage;

Mr. J. Young said that he is proud of Mr. Batiste.

Mr. Burrell congratulated Mr. Batiste, and he looks forward to seeing more of him in the future.

Mr. Jones also commended Mr. Batiste, not only for his athletic accomplishments, but also his academic achievements.

Mr. Epperson congratulated Mr. Batiste and encouraged him to strive for a college scholarship. He also mentioned that the 2028 Olympics will be held in Los Angeles.

Mrs. Gage-Watts echoed the same sentiments as her colleagues and congratulated Mr. Batiste and his parents.

ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

- Walter B. Jacobs Park—Construction Update

Mrs. Bryant said that the concrete for the beams should be poured this week.

Mr. Burrell asked for a minority participation report for this project.

- Apartment Relocation Assistance

Mrs. Bryant announced that the Caddo Parish Commission was able to help eighteen families through Relocation Assistance—mainly from the Jolie and Pines Apartments.

- Intergovernmental Meeting—September 20, 2024

Mrs. Bryant also announced that the quarterly Intergovernmental Meeting will be hosted by the City of Shreveport, and will be held on September 20, 2024.

- June 2024—Financial Statements

Mrs. Bryant said that the June 2024 financial statements were attached to the agenda as well as being placed at each Commissioner's station.

- Greg Kallenberg—Film Prize Update

Mrs. Bryant stated that Mr. Kallenberg would like to postpone his visit to a later date due to several staff members being sick.

- Juvenile Detention

Parish Administrator, Erica Bryant, said that there are twenty-three children in the Detention Center; three of which are OJJ. There are two 17-year olds. There are 623 children on probation.

- West Nile

Mrs. Bryant said that Caddo Parish has its first neuro-invasive West Nile case. She encouraged everyone to take precaution when being outside and to remove stagnant water.

Mr. Burrell is concerned about the drainage ditch in the Queensborough neighborhood, which at times, has standing water. He requested that the area be sprayed.

Mr. J. Young asked for a request form for mosquito droning for each Commissioner's district.

- Commissioner Requests

Mr. Epperson requested that Dr. Martha Whyte be invited to the Commission to provide an update on COVID.

Mrs. Blake requested that Dr. Whyte also provide an updated on the flu.

COMMISSION REMARKS

- *Discussion on Caddo Clean Up and issues related to tire disposal, Tire Amnesty Day, and other environmental nuisances like illegal dumping.*

Mrs. Gage-Watts said that she receives several complaints with regards to tire dumping. She would like to propose hosting a Tire Amnesty Day. She also requested that the Keep Caddo Clean

initiatives include dumpsters onsite throughout the Parish and partnering with recycling facilities. Mrs. Gage-Watts request that this be scheduled during the first week of September. She asked that these initiatives, along with signs, postings, and surveillance cameras, be discussed at the next Public Safety Committee meeting.

Mr. J. Young wanted to know if there will be a dumpster available in every district during Labor Day Weekend. Mrs. Bryant said that there will need to be more discussions.

- *Discussion regarding the Caddo Capacity Builders Workshop.*

Mr. Thomas asked that this be pulled from the agenda. He said that the discussion is more appropriation during an NGO Committee meeting.

- Mr. Atkins asked about a liquor license in the Parish. Mrs. Bryant said that Finance handles those requests. He understood and will reach out to Mrs. Barnett.

- Mr. G. Young responded to the citizens comment. He said that there were ill-feelings about appointing Ms. Lita to the Lakeview Water District. Mr. G. Young said that she was accused of stealing years ago. Mr. G. Young vouches for Ms. Lita—who is a sickly widowed woman. He also said that he never put his hand in Mrs. Hyde's face. Mr. G. Young wants his colleagues to be left alone, and he wants everyone to prosper.

- *Ordinance No. 6438 of 2024, an ordinance to close and abandon two portions of street dedications in the Bremer addition to Rodessa Subdivision, in Section 22, Township 23 North, Range 16 West, in the Parish of Caddo, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6439 of 2024, an ordinance declaring certain adjudicated properties to be surplus and to authorize the Parish Administrator, or a designee, to sell the Parish of Caddo’s tax interest in certain surplus adjudicated properties and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6440 of 2024, an ordinance amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues & Expenditures for the Oil & Gas Fund to appropriate funds for VYJ*
- *Ordinance No. 6441 of 2024, an ordinance to amend and re-enact Section 2-209 et seq of Article VI of the Code of Ordinances relative to the Caddo Parish Living Wage, and otherwise providing with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6442 of 2024, an ordinance to accept the streets in North Club West Unit No. 2 into the Parish of Caddo Road System, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
