

MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION  
OF THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION  
HELD ON THE 16th DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 2024

The Caddo Parish Commission met in a Work Session, on the above date, at 3:30 p.m., in the Government Chambers, with Mr. J. Young, presiding, and the following members in attendance constituting a quorum: Commissioners Atkins, Blake, Burrell, Cothran, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Jones, Kracman, Lazarus, Thomas, G. Young, and Mr. J. Young (12). ABSENT: None (0).

Mr. Jones gave the invocation, and Mr. Epperson led the Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was held to remember the victims, heroes, first responders, and their families during the attack of September 11, 2001.

**AGENDA ADDITIONS**

It was **moved by Mr. Burrell**, seconded by Mr. Jones, *that the agenda be expanded and a Special Resolution commemorating the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Dixie Cold Storage Fire of 1984 and Veterans Proclamation* be placed under New Business.

The President opened the floor for anyone to speak in favor or against this public hearing. There being no one to speak, the President closed the public hearing.

At this time, Mr. Burrell's motion carried unanimously.

**CITIZENS COMMENTS**

Jon Glover came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Ironically, we just [inaudible] that when there are issues on your agenda that are not clear, I will and do send out emails [inaudible] that intent is only to gain an explanation of your purpose of your [inaudible] is to address. Now, there were a couple of pieces of legislation that you all had that bothered me. One being, the advance introduction of Ordinance 6464 of 2024, which is the monuments and the advance of Resolution 65 of 2024. Now, I'm going to ask the questions As I often do, what in both these instances, will the impact be on citizens of the parish the monument issue. I thought we had already resolved about what monuments will and will not be afforded or even put in places whereby the parishes over them and then with the issue of the fairgrounds Stadium, now I read and I shared with you all in an email. What I had found through my research that mayor Arceneaux had addressed this issue per the city. So my question in this regard is what is it? That is being asked of the citizens of the parish to address. Are you asking for funding? Because I believe, even in the information, I share with you all and it was specific, there were dollar amounts that were named, and I just need to know that we're not about to undertake the undertaking that the mayor had given to those uh, Fairgrounds needed to address. Now, if they did not address those things, what is it that? We're saying that, in this instance, we'll be circumvented whereby. Now it becomes a part of us, the citizens of the parish who will have to meet whatever it is that you all decide.

Colby Hughes came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

I was just coming to speak on behalf of Compassions for Lives. They helped me out like when I got out of jail to get a job and motivation. And it's it'd be a shame if their services, you know, they couldn't go in the jail anymore, to help a lot of people out. Help me get a job. I'm still working now.

Ms. Mosely came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Hi everybody. How is everybody doing? I'm, um, speaking on behalf of Compassion for lives. It really has a big impact on my life. I want to thank Miss, Vanessa, for helping me. She gave me a lot of resources to help. Also, to help with the situation that I had going on with my kids, um, she counseled me when I be going through my crisis and I feel like they just offer a lot of good services for With this being of course, it's been incarcerated and I feel like they need to give them more recognition of their services and I really feel like that it will help a lot of people think.

Rowanda Buntyn came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

I volunteer with Compassion for lives since 2013, when they first came and um, You know, Carla and Vanessa are really compassionate about, you know, helping with the community helping with, you know, people who have been incarcerated, I know for a fact, you know, a time where you know, Miss Buntyn was, you know, headed to take an inmate to a job interview on a Saturday. She took this person, you know, he needed a ride and she took it to him to get a ride and you know her car flooded And you know it wasn't total water was damaged. All, you know, just to make sure that he got to his interview. And, you know, get the job. So I have seen, you know, people come in and, you know, I need to see Miss Carla, I need to see Miss Vanessa. I just got out, you know, I need, I need help, I have also witnessed Carla Buntyn, you know, goal, you know, in her own pocket. When they, you know, I don't have anything Miss Buntyn, nothing. And you know, I've seen her going home pocket and give them money. And help. So she's very, you know, compassionate about, you know, compassion for lives and helping, you know, the community, you know, her Vanessa. Also, you know, she does great with counseling and I think that you know [inaudible] needs to stick around you know to help. They help everybody. Anybody in need, they will Thank

you.

Michael Washington came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

How is everybody doing? My accountability at this time is to express what I've seen with Compassion for Lives. I've been with them for about a year. During that year, I've seen a lot. I learned a lot. They're compassionate, which means they're in it with you. So that's really got me I guess down with them like that because they help. Vanessa, she does great. She's a great counselor. I mean it's just a wonderful organization. I love it. That's pretty much what I got to say about it.

Evelyn Beverly came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

I want to speak on behalf of Compassion for Lives, which is Miss Carla and Mr. Nelson, which they have been wonderful to me since I've been released um, from being incarcerated. They helped me with a lot of things and they still helped me to this day. They just helped me get a job. They helped me. Um, actually I'm back in school as well. I'm going to get my GED and I'm going back to nursing school. So I just want to say, this is a good organization for them. It's well, it completes many more people. So I just want to say thank you to them, and thank you.

Jade Blake came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Hi, how are you? Um, I'm here to speak on behalf of Compassion for Lives. They uh, do a lot inside and outside of the jail system. They helped me relearn how to be a parent to my kids. They help me figure out my triggers and, and things that I can do to step away from the life that I was living. They helped me get back in school. Me and Vanessa are supposed to be meeting up after this to continue to get my help and what I need in order to be what I need to be to be an active citizen in society.

Corey Lafitte came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

two years ago, I was incarcerated and I got put in Miss Vanessa's class. Of course I just wanted the time the free time to get out free—the months it took of my sentence, but as I got into her class, I realized that she gave me the tools I needed to be able to live sober life. I did get my time off, and I got out from there. She helped me get into counseling. I do counseling with her. I did my anger management with her. She got me a job. I went to Horseshoe. I've been at Horseshoe for a year now. Not only that I had lost my baby and I've had my baby back for a year now. She pushed me, kept me going, I finished active recovery, all because of Vanessa, anytime I have a problem, I call this lady and this lady answers the phone, no matter what time. Not only that I got my apartment. I needed furniture for my apartment because CPS said, you have to have furniture before, you can get your baby back. Miss Vanessa made sure that the Nesting Egg. She furnished me with, with furniture, for my apartment. So I could get my baby back in time for me to get my baby back. I've had my baby back a year now. I've been at my job, had my baby back and she's giving me all these tools to succeed. They really are a great organization and I love her to death without her. I don't know what kind of person I would be. Thank you.

Lakeshia Kennedy came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Hi everyone. I'm here speaking on behalf of Compassion for Lives, Miss Carla, Miss Vanessa. I met them two about 2 years ago, a little bit over 2 years ago. And um, I was becoming a new mom and I took some parenting classes. And um, they are very loving. They are very open and what I mean about open is that they are very honest. They are very Godly, and their service was very professional, and the service of rendering that service. When I looked up for that parenting, they were charging by the hours, and that was like \$30-\$40 an hour. That could hit hard depending on how long or how many days or how many hours you want to take. Parenting classes for their—what they offer is free. understanding that everybody, some people come from different backgrounds and some people like some women just spoke are getting out of jail. That wasn't my case, but if you're getting out of jail, you're not, you don't have the funds. So for this service to be Uh, in Jeopardy of being shut down, that would hit a lot of people hard and the community were hurt, not just one person, but the community will take a hard hit. So I'm asking you guys Use your the power that we have that you guys have to think about this and make a really honest wholehearted Godly decision. We all have to remember that. We can because I'm a business person. Also, and in the field that I do, I do hair. And every maybe twice a year, I do free services for the community for those that lack those that don't that are less fortunate. And that comes from humility that comes from, we have power to do whatever we want. But we got, we have to understand that coming from a Godly stance. We can do that. Sometimes we have to swallow our pride and do what is needed for people that may not be in our shoes. So I pray that you guys will hear us all out and do. What is best for the community? Thank you all.

Kendrick Dorsey came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

Hey, how y'all doing? Welcome Mr. Dorsey I just wanted to. I want to speak on behalf of them and just saying, what I really admire about the program is Miss Vanessa and Carla. They truly care about people, you know. And you can have people that could be in that position. They might not get the most out of people that really see the potential in people that really brings some opportunity out of, you know, like returning citizens. You know. And uh, what they did for me was, I was working a job as a welder to where I travel and I was full, you know, they were treating me good. Well, while I was in between jobs Oh, they had, they were about to get me on the Safer Industries, but I got the call back to go to my previous job. But in the process, they got me pre-enrolled for business administration school. I got a landscaping

business already. So even though, I'm in position where I can help myself a lot, they still found a way to add to me, you know, it's a blessing. And I don't really put my timing and stuff like most times people tell me, come speak, or do something and I'll be here, you know what I'm saying? But the fact that what they trying to do and what they stand for, I made time to come today in that series of life, you know, I believe even them just like they believe in us. Have a blessed one.

### **VISITORS**

- Caddo Clerk of Court, Mike Spence  
Caddo Registrar of Voters, Dale Sibley

Registrar Sibley came before the Commission and gave an update prior to the election season. For the November 5 Election, early voting will begin on October 18, which is an extended early voting period. Anyone who would like to vote needs to be registered by October 7 for this election. The Registrar's Office will have people at libraries registering people to vote. The schedule will be posted on the [caddovoter.org](http://caddovoter.org) website.

For anyone who would like to have a Registration Drive, they must fill out a form and submit it through the Secretary of State's website or through the Registrar of Voters Office. All of the completed voter registration applications must be submitted within 30 days of the date that the person signs it.

The State has a Nursing Home Voting Assistance Program, which is a voluntary program for the nursing homes. The residents have to request it though. They can choose to stay with mailing in their ballots, or they can choose to have paper ballots at the homes.

Beginning in January 2025, there will be a four-year limit for those people who are on the Over 65 Program. The State will send out notices prior to those voters being "kicked off" the mail-in ballot lists. The voters will then have to re-submit their voting applications.

Registrar Sibley said that there were several changes made to absentee ballots. There are three things that will automatically cause your ballots to be challenged: missing voter signature, missing witness signature, and missing mother's maiden name. If any of those are missing, it will go before the Parish Board of Election Supervisors for determination. Oftentimes, the board will reject those votes. In the absentee ballots, you will receive an instructional slip, completed sample flap, and the secrecy sleeve. All this information is available on the Secretary of State's website, Registrar's website, and the Geaux Vote app. Only immediate family members can sign more than one ballot. Also, only an immediate family member can return more than one ballot. If anything is missing, or if anything is done incorrectly, the Registrar's Office will notify you. You can correct those issues during the cure period.

Mrs. Gage-Watts wanted to know how many workshops were conducted this year with regards to voting. Registrar Sibley explained that the ROV is an administrative office which is only supposed to do those things that the statute says, so they are not authorized to programming and outreach. He said that they do accept invitations to speak at events though.

Mrs. Gage-Watts then asked for an update on the additional early voting location. Registrar Sibley said that he received the resolution, but they haven't started the process of opening an additional site. He explained that they do not have enough staff to man the additional site. Once the site is open, it will become a precinct.

Mrs. Gage-Watts then asked for an informational sheet regarding the information he disseminated today. Registrar Sibley said that it is in several different places, including on the website.

Mr. Epperson wanted to know if there was a cover letter included with the applications sent to the nursing homes. Registrar Sibley said there was.

Mr. Cothran said that there is confusion in his community, that people hosting registration drives have to submit a packet, then wait 30 days before having a drive. Registrar Sibley said that was not true. He explained again that the person hosting the drive has 30 days to submit the applications back.

Mr. G. Young wanted to know if these proceedings will be available to the public. The Clerk of the Commission said that this meeting is being recorded and will be uploaded to YouTube at a later date.

Mr. G. Young then wanted to know if the new laws were in the Civil Code. Registrar Sibley said that they are in the Election Code of the Civil Code.

Clerk of Court, Mike Spence, came before the Commission and updated everyone on the precincts that have moved: Werner Park is moving to Caddo Heights; Praise Temple has moved to Oak Park; Sunset Acres has moved to Westwood; and Ascension Classical has moved to Norris Ferry. This will be the first presidential elections with the new reduced precincts. There will be approximately sixty clerks at the different precincts. There will be 2-3 machines at each precinct.

Mr. Atkins wanted to know if the voters received letters regarding their precinct changes. Mr. Spence said that they did. He also mentioned that the Parish of Caddo will have a representative at the precincts helping direct votes to the right place.

Mrs. Gage-Watts wanted to know more about the Election Commissioners. Mr. Spence said that they receive applications year-round. They fill out an app, watch a video, and take a test. After completing those, they are eligible to work.

Mr. Spence also mentioned that the machines are from 1994, but the process has started to receive new machines. The goal is to have it for the next federal election.

- Friends of Fairgrounds Field

Mr. Bill Roberston came before the Commission and talked about saving Fairgrounds Field. He said this is about preserving a quality of life feature for the inner-city. It was built in 1986 by the City with a bond issue and hosted the Captains through the years. It was built as a multi-purpose facility. Friends of Fairgrounds Field is here today requesting a resolution of support in saving the facility.

Their position is that if they are given some time, they can put a team together that will own, manage, and program the facility. It will no longer be a city facility. They are fighting to get as much support as possible to bring it back to life for a baseball facility, soccer venue, football, etc.

Mr. Linc Coleman said that there are several interested parties in preserving Fairgrounds Field. He said that this facility could host a number of youth involved activities. He said that they are losing students in the Caddo Parish Public School Systems, and this is not a sustainable trend. Many people have moved out of Shreveport/Caddo Parish.

Mr. Coleman also explained that Fairgrounds Field is part of the Fairgrounds Campus, which is approximately 172 acres. It includes the Hirsch Coliseum, Independence Stadium, Ag Building, Boys & Girls Club, State Museum, etc. He explained that the City wants to tear it down due to it being structurally unsound, water penetration, bats, and they didn't know how to use it. Mr. Coleman explained that they hired contractors who told them that the facility is sound. With regards to the water penetration, there is a combination of city water lines that are clogged and slightly undersized, which all can be upsized. With the not knowing what to use the facility for, they spoke with several organizations and compiled a comprehensive report on how the facility could be used for the youth. It is much more than a baseball park, he said. Mr. Coleman is pleading to help save this facility.

Mr. Atkins wanted to know the lawsuit to halt the demolition. Mr. Coleman said that the suit is to stop the demolition until the City recognizes the health aspects of the stadium. The State Health Department wrote a cease and desist letter on the demolition until the City can address the health aspects of the stadium.

Mr. Burrell said that this stadium is in his district, and he is in support of preserving this facility.

Mr. Coleman said that the citizens voted to preserve Fairgrounds Field in a 2019 bond issue. He also said that they have a formula for public-private funding, but they just need the City's cooperation. Mr. Coleman also said that Fairgrounds has been in Shreveport for 120 years, and this should be preserved.

Mr. Christopher Coh said that there is important work that needs to be done in Shreveport. There are number of buildings that need to be repaired. He would like to save what is Shreveport already has, and not build new buildings. Mr. Coh also mentioned that this is a visible location from I-20, and would like to save Fairgrounds Field.

### **ADMINISTRATOR REPORT**

- Juvenile Detention

Parish Administrator, Erica Bryant, said that there are fifteen children in the Detention Center; three of which are OJJ. There are three 17-year olds, and sixteen children at CCC. There are 535 children on probation.

- Intergovernmental Meeting

Mrs. Bryant said that the Intergovernmental Meeting is scheduled for October 11 at 11:30 a.m. It will be held at Independence Stadium.

- War on Litter

Mrs. Bryant announced that the War on Litter press conference is September 17, 2024. The event will be held on September 21, 2024.

- August, 2024 Financial Statements

Mrs. Bryant reminded the Commissioners that the August 2024 Financials are attached to the agenda and at everyone's stations.

## COMMISSION REMARKS

- Mr. Atkins asked about Compassion for Lives. Mrs. Bryant said that the Parish of Caddo does not have control over what the Sheriff allows at the correctional center. She also mentioned that the Caddo Parish Commission does provide funds for Compassion for Lives.

Mr. G. Young said that the Sheriff's Office doesn't provide any funding for Compassion for Lives.

- Attorney Frazier announced that Assistant Parish Attorney Henry Bernstein will be retiring at the end of January 2025.
- Mrs. Blake said that Compassion for Lives helps put people back into society. She commended the work that they do in the community.

There was not a President's Report, so the Commission moved onto Old Business.

## OLD BUSINESS

It was **moved by Mr. Kracman**, seconded by Mr. Lazarus, *to appoint Jessica Tullis to the PZC to fill the unexpired term of Damon Humphries* be moved to Thursday's agenda for consideration. Motion failed, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners (4). NAYS: Commissioners (8). ABSENT: None (0). ABSTAIN: None (0).

## NEW BUSINESS

It was **moved by Mr. J. Young**, seconded by Mr. Thomas, *that Ordinance No. 6463 of 2024, PZC Case 24-01-CTAP, an ordinance to amend Volume II of the Code of Ordinances of the Parish of Caddo, as amended, the Caddo Parish Unified Development Code, relative to short-term rentals, with all their provisions included herein, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for introduction. Motion carried unanimously.

It was **moved by Mr. Epperson**, seconded by Mrs. Gage-Watts, *that Ordinance No. 6464 of 2024, an ordinance prohibiting the placement of certain monuments on Parish property, and otherwise providing with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for introduction as stated in the Work Session.

Mr. Epperson would like the Ordinance to reflect the following language:

Sec. 2-7.-Prohibition of certain Monuments on Caddo Parish Property (a.) There shall be no memorials, monuments, statues, plaques, flags, etc., erected on Caddo Parish Property, or displayed in any buildings owned by the Parish of Caddo, of individuals, organizations, groups, or entities that advocate bigotry, division, hatred and racism. (b.) There shall be no memorials, monuments, statues, plaques, flags etc., erected on Caddo Parish Property, or displayed in any buildings owned by the Parish of Caddo, of individuals that have been found guilty of obstructing a constitutionally mandated process.

**Substitute motion by Mrs. Blake**, seconded by Mr. Kracman, *that Ordinance No. 6464 of 2024, an ordinance prohibiting the placement of certain monuments on Parish property, and otherwise providing with respect thereto* be remanded to the Long Range Planning Committee.

Mrs. Blake said that this ordinance is redundant to state and federal laws.

**Substitute motion by Mr. Kracman**, seconded by Mr. Atkins, *that that Ordinance No. 6464 of 2024, an ordinance prohibiting the placement of certain monuments on Parish property, and otherwise providing with respect thereto* be tabled. Motion failed, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Atkins, Blake, Kracman, Lazarus, and J. Young (5). At this time, Mr. Epperson's original motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Burrell, Cothran, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Jones, Thomas, and G. Young (7). NAYS: Commissioners Atkins, Blake, Kracman, Lazarus, and J. Young (5). ABSENT: None (0). ABSTAIN: None (0).

It was **moved by Mr. Burrell**, seconded by Mr. Thomas, *that Resolution No. 65 of 2024, a resolution expressing the support of the Caddo Parish Commission for the efforts to renovate and improve Fairgrounds Field and the efforts of the Friends of the Fairgrounds Field towards that goal, and otherwise*

*providing with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for consideration.

Mr. Burrell said that this facility has been neglected over the years. He feels that the restoration of the facility is for the quality of life in that particular area. Mr. Burrell also said that this resolution would not affect the lawsuit.

**Substitute motion by Mrs. Gage-Watts**, seconded by Mr. Cothran, *that Resolution No. 65 of 2024, a resolution expressing the support of the Caddo Parish Commission for the efforts to renovate and improve Fairgrounds Field and the efforts of the Friends of the Fairgrounds Field towards that goal, and otherwise providing with respect thereto* be postponed to the October 14, 2024 Work Session.

Mrs. Gage-Watts agrees with improve and renovate the areas of Fairgrounds Field, but this is currently in litigation. She would like the lawsuit to be settled prior to passing this resolution.

Mr. Burrell said that this wouldn't affect the lawsuit. He asked for support in moving this resolution forward.

Mr. Cothran agreed with Mrs. Gage-Watts. He wanted to know what this resolution would do in terms of the lawsuit. Attorney Frazier said that it could be perceived that this resolution shows support of their argument.

Mr. G. Young said that the area has declined over the years. He is in support of revitalizing the City and getting rid of the blight. He also feels that they should extend a professional courtesy to the City and allow the lawsuit to play out first.

Mrs. Blake would like to get more information on this resolution prior to voting on it.

Mr. Burrell said that this resolution has nothing to do with the lawsuit, and he is trying to protect his district. The City has not resolved the health issues with the stadium.

- *Ordinance No. 6457 of 2024, an ordinance to adopt the values fixed, or to be fixed by the Louisiana Tax Commission on all assessments for railways and other public service corporations, and to instruct the assessor to extend such assessments and values on the tax roll of the Parish of Caddo for the year 2024, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6458 of 2024, an ordinance to set the General Purpose and Special Purpose Millages providing for an increase in the millage rates not in excess of the prior years maximum rates, as allowed by Article VII, Section 23 of The Louisiana Constitution of 1974 and La R.S. 47:1705 (b), levying and imposing taxes and assessments for 2024 on all the property subject to taxation in the Parish of Caddo, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6459 of 2024, an ordinance to set the General Purpose and Special Purpose Millages providing for millage rate adjustments, as allowed by Article VII, Section 23 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974 and La R.S. 47:1705 (b), levying and imposing taxes and assessments for 2024 on all the property subject to taxation in the Parish of Caddo, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto.*
- *Ordinance 6460 of 2024, an ordinance setting the assessment of property classified as timberlands and to instruct the Assessor to include said assessment on the tax roll of the Parish of Caddo for the year 2024, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6461 of 2024, an ordinance to sell surplus property under Chapter 19, Article II, Division 3 of the Code of Ordinances relative to donation of adjudicated property acquired by the Parish under La. R.S. 47:2236 et seq., to authorize the donation of property to Gods of Grind, LLC, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
- *Ordinance No. 6462 of 2024, an ordinance to sell surplus property under Chapter 19, Article II, Division 3 of the Code of Ordinances relative to donation of adjudicated property acquired by the Parish under La. R.S. 47:2236 et seq., to authorize the donation of property to Caddo Parish Fire Protection District One, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto*
