

## PRECINCT SURVEY FORM

#### General Instructions

This precinct survey form was developed as a tool to guide the Registrar and Governing Authority through the review process for precincts with over 2200 active registered voters and those with less than 300 active registered voters. It is a step-by-step process that will ensure we are all meeting the requirements of the law. The Registrar of Voters is responsible for completing the first part of the Precinct Survey Form for each precinct at issue and then submitting the form to the Parish Governing Authority (Parish) for completion of Part Two.

Following completion of both parts, if a precinct has over 2200 active registered voters, it is the responsibility of the governing authority to create a plan to split or divide the precinct along a visible feature. If a precinct has less than 300 active registered voters, it is also the responsibility of the Parish to develop a plan to merge or consolidate the precinct.

#### Splits:

If one precinct has over 2200 active voters and must be separated into two new precincts

 Must be submitted to the legislature (Bill Blair at BlairB@legis.la.gov) for approval prior to adoption

#### Merges:

If two separate precincts will be merged into one single precinct

- You can merge an under 300 precinct with an adjacent precinct if they share some voting districts, even if they are in different polling locations
- You can merge a phantom precinct (that has no voters) with another precinct
- You should avoid merging precincts if the total amount of active voters in the new precinct is close to or more than 2200 voters
- Must be submitted to SOS (Heather Meyers at <u>Heather.Meyers@sos.la.gov</u>) for approval prior to adoption

### Consolidations:

If two separate precincts are at the same polling location and can share commissioners

- You can consolidate precincts located in the polling location to share commissioners, but the
  precincts will remain distinct, with separate precinct registers and separate voting machines
- You can move a precinct to a new location to consolidate it with another precinct already at the new location
- Must be submitted to SOS (Alise Babin at Alise Babin@sos.la.gov), no prior approval needed

If a merger or consolidation is not possible, the precinct may be eligible for an exemption (a geographically isolated and unincorporated area, one precinct municipality, or for a consolidated precinct). Exemptions are requested by the Parish and approved by the Secretary of State.

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### (B.) Merge (OPTION B)

## SUMMARY:

The Parish must complete Section Two based on the answers provided by the Registrar of Voters in Section One.

- If the ROV answered "yes" to Part A-1 or A-2, the Parish should select OPTION A.
- If the ROV answered "yes" to Part B, the Parish should select <u>OPTION B</u>. The Parish must also take action by (1) obtaining approval from SOS and then (2) pass an ordinance to merge precincts. Note that the Parish must seek approval from SOS <u>before</u> passing an ordinance.
- If the ROV answered "yes" to Part C, the Parish should select <u>OPTION C.</u> The precinct must then be consolidated.
- If the ROV answered "yes" to Part D, the Parish should select <u>OPTION D</u>. The precinct
  must be moved to a new polling location and consolidated with another precinct.
- If the ROV answered "no" to all questions above, the Parish must pay for all election expenses for this precinct, and should select OPTION E.
- The Parish may also apply to the Secretary of State for a special exemption for extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances. <u>Note: This exemption is rare and is only granted at the discretion of the SOS.</u>

You must submit this ordinance or resolution to SOS

OPTION E. The polling place for this precinct is not located in the polling place of any other precinct. No action will be taken, and the governing authority will pay all election expenses for this precinct. There will be no cost sharing with the State.
