# History of Robinson's Rescue

---



In 2005, concerned Shreveport citizens began researching proven ways to reduce pet overpopulation and shelter euthanasia. They found that high-quality, high-volume, low-cost spay/neuter was the most effective and humane solution. On September 15, 2008, Robinson's Rescue opened as Louisiana's first clinic of its kind and one of only 192 ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance clinics in the nation—led since day one by our CEO and Medical Director, Dr. Andrea Master Everson.



# Our Mission, Vision, and Impact!

---



**Robinson's Rescue works to end pet overpopulation and unnecessary euthanasia by providing affordable spay/neuter surgeries and educating the community on responsible pet ownership. Our vision is a North Louisiana where every pet has a loving home and euthanasia is no longer needed. In 17 years, we've performed over 100,000 surgeries —averaging 40 a day —saving millions of lives and serving parishes across the region by removing financial barriers to high - quality care.**

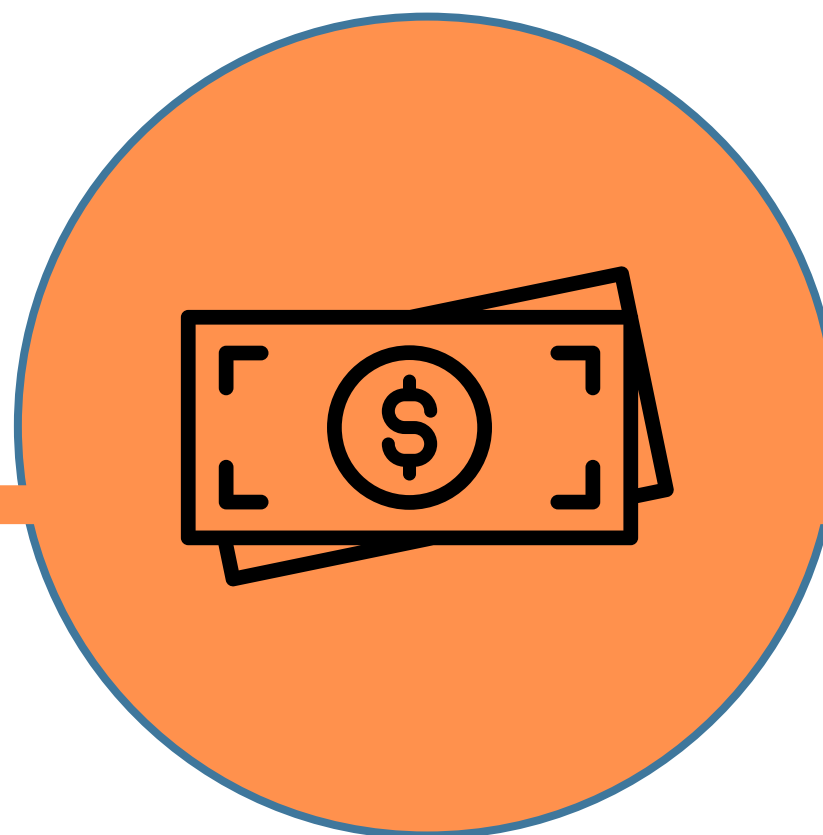

# Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program



## Pricing :

- **Cats:** \$38 neuter (male) | ~~48~~ \$48 spay (female)
- **Dogs** \$58 neuter (male) | ~~68~~ \$68 spay (female)
- **Feral Cats** (includes rabies): ~~33~~ \$33 neuter (male) | ~~43~~ \$43 spay (female)

## Additional Services (with surgery) :

- Rabies vaccine \$10
- Microchip (lifetime registration): \$0
- Additional surgical fees may apply (e.g., pregnancy, hernias)

## Community Impact :

- Supports pet owners and regional animal welfare organizations
- Thursdays = “Shelter Days”— dedicated to local shelters & rescue groups





# Subsidized Spay/Neuter Incentive Program

---

Robinson's Rescue offers FREE spay/neuter and rabies vaccines for North Louisiana residents who:

Earn \$2,100 or less per month (single)

Earn \$3,100 or less per month (married couples)

Our goal is to ensure everyone can provide their pets with high-quality care, regardless of income.







# SSNIP Voucher Day - Expanding Access

---



- In its 2nd year, the program effectively reaches residents most in need
- 15% of parish residents lack internet access, limiting online scheduling
- Hosting at community hubs (e.g., libraries on transit routes) improves accessibility & convenience





# Education and Outreach Program

---



In addition to our surgical programs, Robinson's Rescue operates a strong education and outreach initiative. Our team of volunteers and staff attends community events to raise awareness about our services and the importance of spay/neuter and responsible pet ownership. The need for education in our region is great, and by engaging directly with our neighbors, we are not only advancing our mission but also connecting with new clients whose pets come part of the solution to ending animal overpopulation.







# The Life Saving Effects of Spay/Neuter

---

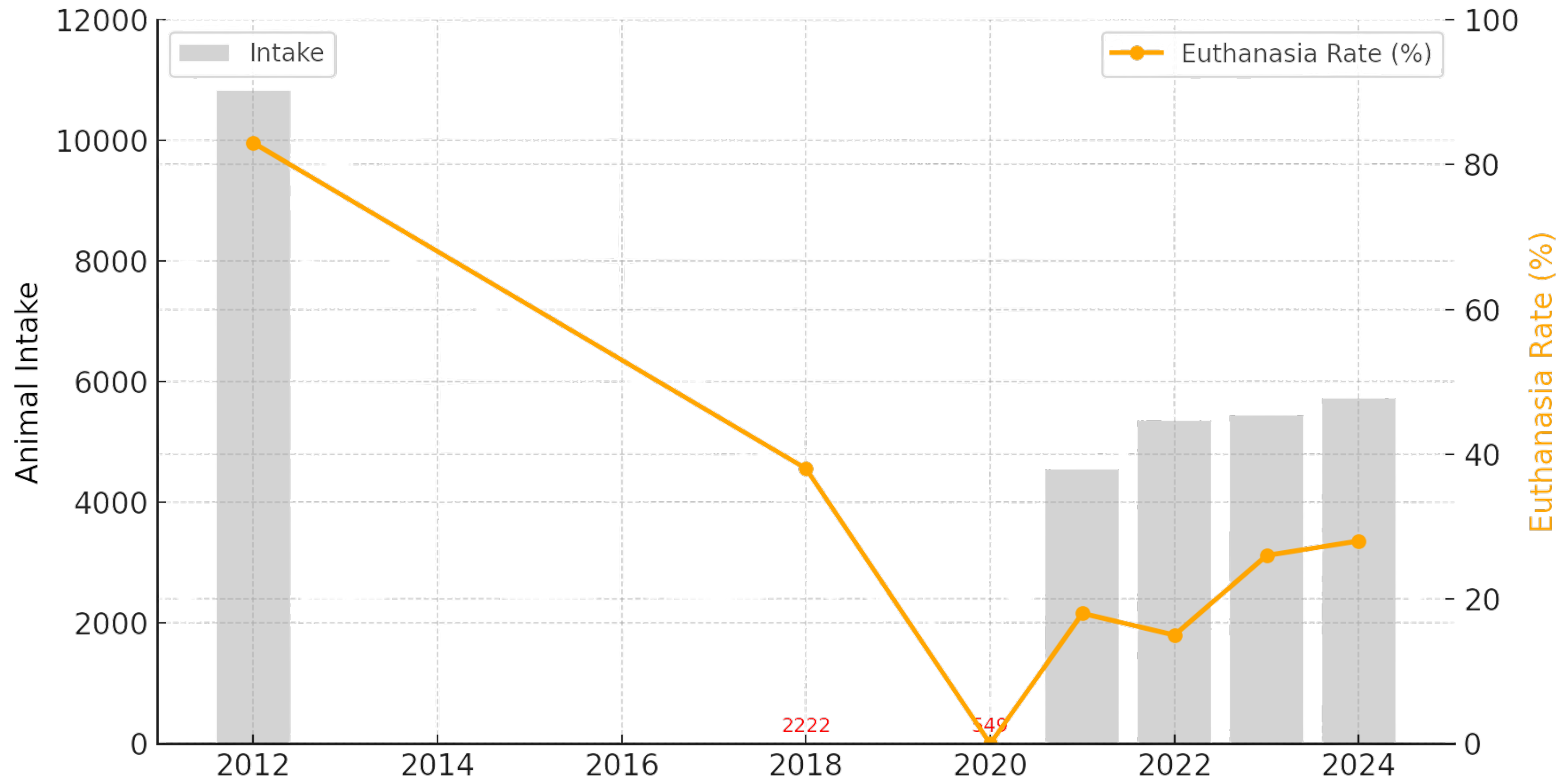


**In 2012, CPAS took in 10,825 animals with an euthanasia rate of nearly 83%.**

**By 2018, the rate had fallen to 38% (2,222 animals), and by 2020, only 549 were euthanized. Intake dropped to 4,549 in 2021, with an 18% rate, and then to 5,349 pets in 2022, with a rate under 15%. In 2023, 5,448 pets were admitted with a 26% rate, and in 2024, intake rose to 5,718 with euthanasia at 28%. This overall progress reflects the steady growth of our spay/neuter surgeries each year.**

---



**According to statistics by North Shore Animal League..**

- By spaying and neutering just one female and one male dog, more than 67,000 births can be prevented in just 6 years!**
- By spaying and neutering just one male and one female cat, more than 2,000 unwanted births can be prevented in just four years – and more than 2 million in 8 years.**

**These numbers are staggering!**
